Singapore International Water Week and CleanEnviro Summit Singapore successfully enabled partnerships for Climate Action

The Singapore International Water Week (SIWW) and the CleanEnviro Summit Singapore (CESG) held from 17 to 21 April 2022 drew over 15,000 attendees from around the world to collaborate on and advance climate action. Thought leaders, experts and practitioners across sectors exchanged ideas, generated new business opportunities, and co-created innovative solutions to climate change. The Water Expo and Environment Expo also featured over 300 local and international exhibitors, showcasing innovations in water and environment management.

Official opening of the Jurong Island Desalination Plant

On 17 April 2022, Singapore's 5th desalination plant, the Jurong Island Desalination Plant (JIDP), was launched at the SIWW 2022. The plant is capable of producing up to 30 million gallons of potable water daily. It is 5 per cent more energyefficient than conventional desalination plants, as its co-location with Tuas Power's Tembusu Multi-Utilities Complex (TMUC) allows JIDP to leverage TMUC's existing infrastructure for seawater intake.

Meeting with UK COP26 President Alok Sharma

On 7 April 2022, Minister Fu met with UK COP26 President Alok Sharma and discussed how Singapore and the UK can maintain the momentum for global climate action in the lead up to COP27. They also discussed ways to support the energy transition and adaptation needs in the region, including through capacity building, collaboration in renewable energy, and facilitating green finance/carbon markets. Singapore will continue to work closely with the UK COP26 Presidency, the incoming Egypt COP27 Presidency, and other Parties to advance global climate action and achieve a successful COP27.

Meeting with Johor Menteri Besar Onn Hafiz Ghazi

On 18 April 2022, Minister Fu met Johor Menteri Besar Onn Hafiz Ghazi and his team from Johor State Assembly, on the sidelines of the SIWW and CESG. Minister Fu shared the priorities in the Singapore Green Plan 2030 and reiterated Singapore's commitment to work with regional and international partners to advance climate action. Meeting with US Trade Representative Katherine Tai

On 5 April 2022, Minister Fu met with US Trade Representative Katherine Tai at the Singapore Botanic Gardens. They affirmed the close partnership between Singapore and the US, and the commitment to explore further cooperation on environmental sustainability. They also spoke on ways to incorporate sustainability into trade and economic activities, and the need to build capabilities in this area in the region.

4th Asia Pacific Water Summit

On 23 April 2022, SMS Dr Amy Khor spoke at the 4th Asia Pacific Water Summit (APWS), which was convened after a five-year hiatus. SMS Khor shared on Singapore's water story, including how we are investing heavily in water technology, infrastructure and research. SMS Khor also underscored the importance for countries to work together and learn from each other. For example, Singapore has benefitted from the submerged (MBR) membrane bio-reactor technology pioneered by Tokyo University Professor Kazuo Yamamoto. The MBR technology allows effective treatment of waste water while reducing energy consumption.
