Singapore-Indonesia MoU on Climate Change

On 21 March 2022, Singapore and Indonesia signed a Memorandum of Understanding on Climate Change and Sustainability. Under the MoU, both nations will cooperate on carbon pricing and markets, nature-based solutions and an ecosystem-based approach, clean technology and solutions, and green and blended finance. Ms Grace Fu, Singapore's Minister for Sustainability and the Environment, hosted Indonesia's Coordinating Minister for Maritime Affairs and Investment Luhut Binsar Pandjaitan at the TuasOne Waste-to-Energy Plant, where insights on Singapore's approach to waste management.

They also discussed ways to rally Parties and non-Party stakeholders towards advancing climate action, and affirmed the importance of continued bilateral cooperation in environmental sustainability.
